ember days

Ember days are observed at the beginning of the four seasons of the Liturgical Year to give thanks for the blessings of the past year and beg for further graces for the season ahead. The ember days consecrate the seasons to God and prepare by penance those about to be ordained. The faithful ought to pray for good priests especially during the ember days.
